We think that all of these happenings are reason to call for a rousing round of applause for our legislators. We also know that such an undertaking will not have guaranteed approval or support and we will have to help our legislators help us. We hope everyone stays on board with this effort as it's not over yet. There is light at the end of the tunnel however.

The Piñon Canyon Expansion Opposition Coalition is a broad-based coalition representing communities across Southern Colorado in their opposition to the proposed military expansion.
